1-Two Oceans Aquarium

The Two Oceans Aquarium is more than a home for marine creatures, it is a place of learning. But don't tell the kids that. Tell them a certain clownfish lives there along with his whole family, then take them to see the clownfish exhibit. And adorable penguins with happy feet live there. For younger kids, there are puppet shows with lovable characters like Hatch the Turtle and Peter the Penguin. Older kids may want to see the sea spiders, sea serpents or ragged tooth sharks. 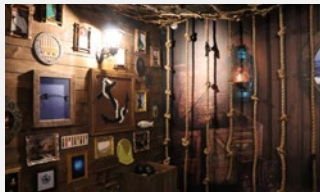
3-The Cape Wheel

A ride on this giant Ferris wheel is great for youngsters of all ages. Riders get raised to a height of 40 metres, but it is perfectly safe because each little cabin is fully enclosed, with no open doors while in motion. Each cabin is also fully air-conditioned for comfort. Aside from the panoramic views of mountain and landscape, kids could get treated to views of whales and dolphins frolicking in the bay, because marine creatures are far easier to spot from above, especially on a clear day. 2-Scratch Patch & Cave Golf

Visualise hundreds and thousands of polished stones on the floor, wall to wall, and the kids have to scratch through them in search of their favourite tumble-polished gemstones, such as Tiger's Eye, Rose Quartz, Amethyst, Jasper, Agates, Lapis Lazuli and Crystals. It's a treasure hunt that keeps them focused for ages. While the youngsters are searching for gemstones, older teens and adults can test their prowess on the 18-hole, indoor, mini golf course. 7-Steamboat Vicky

8-Artjamming, V&A Waterfront

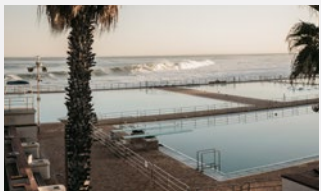

9-Iziko South African Museum

A natural history and science museum with riveting zoology, palaeontology and archaeology collections, in the Company's Garden. The marine exhibits depict the weird and wonderful life forms in our oceans, such as the coelacanth, a blue whale skeleton more than 20m long, and massive megatooth shark jaws. There's even a booth where you can sit and enjoy the songs of the humpback whale. Ancient rock art forms part of an exhibit that explores the life of our San ancestors. 11-Sea Point Swimming Pools

The Sea Point Pavilion in Lower Beach Road has four pools, so it's the perfect place to spend a warm summer's day with the whole family, because there's a pool to suit everyone from toddlers to adults. The four pools of different sizes and depths include an Olympic-sized pool, a 5m deep springboard diving pool, a children's pool and a very shallow splash pool. 10-Iziko Planetarium and Digital Dome

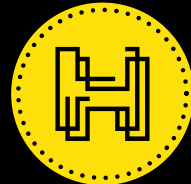

12-Blue Train Park

You'll find Blue Train Park on Beach Road, Mouille Point, next to the lighthouse, and there's a lot more to this park than meets the eye. 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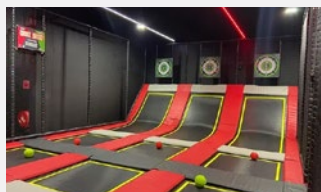

13-Green Point Park

This is a piece of paradise for parents and kids, and even the family dog, since dogs on leash are welcome. The park is perfect for family picnics, and has two children's play parks for different age groups. There's the Tot-Lot Play Park for kiddies 2 to 6, and the Adventure Play Park for older children. 14-Total Ninja

Total Ninja in Black River Park, Observatory, is an indoor fun and fitness venue where kids can develop their Ninja super powers. The concept is based on the TV series Ninja Warrior, and the Warped Wall is a great favourite with most kids. 15-Hop-on Hop-off City Sightseeing Bus

Buy tickets online in advance, rather than same day. The Classic Hop-on Hop-off Ticket gives you access to 3 hop-on hop-off loops, with commentary in your choice of 15 languages, plus a walking tour, so it becomes a fun learning experience. If you spot a place you want to spend time at, simply hop off the bus, and when you're done, wait at the same bus stop, and hop onboard the next bus to come along. 16-Clay Café in the City

17-Heart of Cape Town Museum

This museum is a source of great pride for any South African. It is located in the old main building of Groote Schuur Hospital, which is entirely appropriate, since it spotlights the world's first successful heart transplant which took place in this very hospital in 1967, and celebrates the team who pioneered it, led by Dr. Chris Barnard. Visitors are given an insightful look into the day of that first transplant, plus behind-the-scene moments that changed the course of medical history. 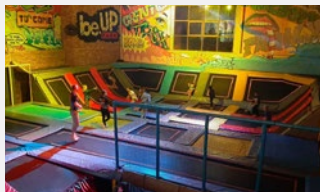
18-Century Karting

This is a track for go-kart driving, with go-karts and helmets on site for hire, the perfect nursery track for the next Jody Scheckter (or Jolene Scheckter). Aside from being great fun, it also teaches kids several valuable insights into the skill of driving. They don't need a driver's licence for this, but they have to be at least 1.6 metres tall. 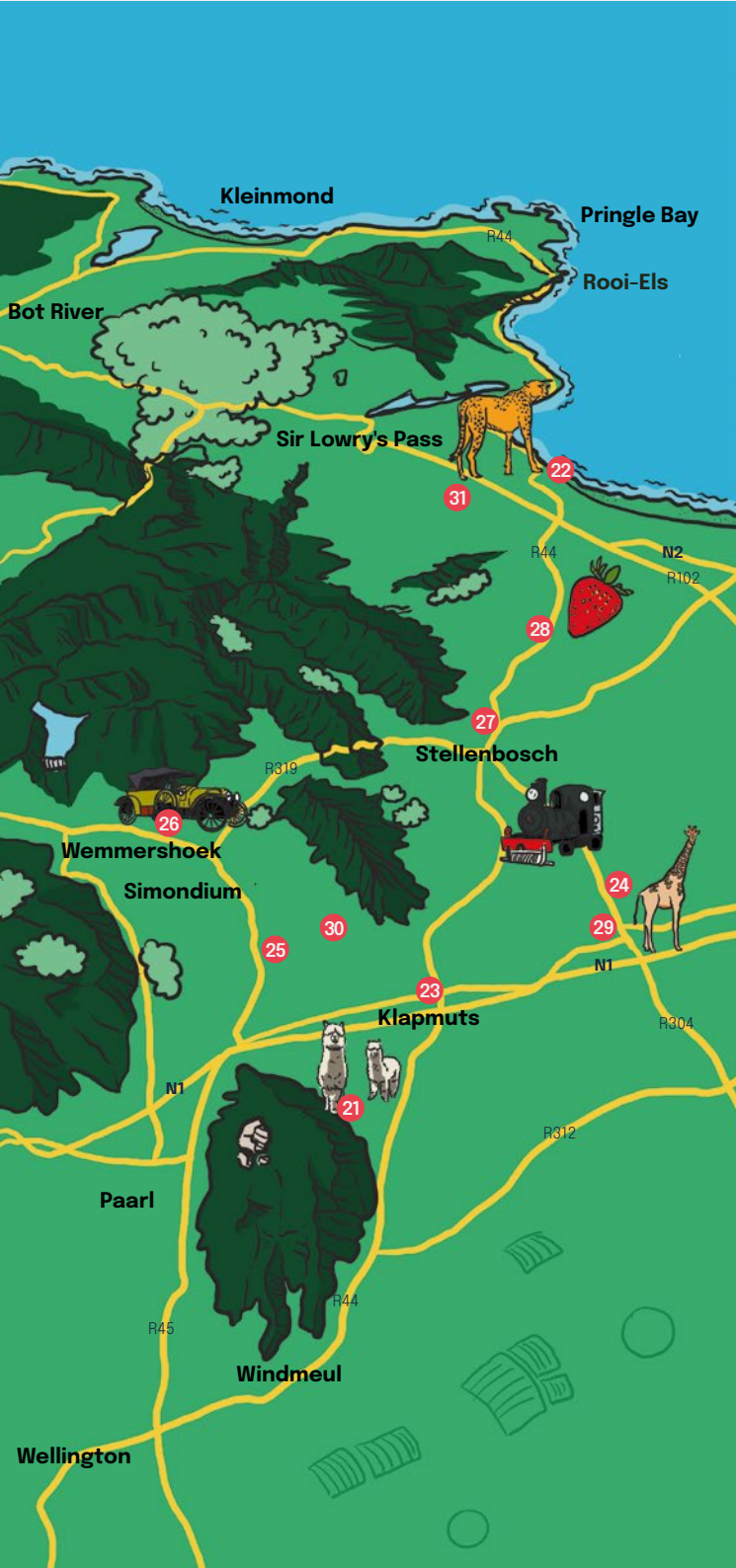
19-Cape Town Science Centre

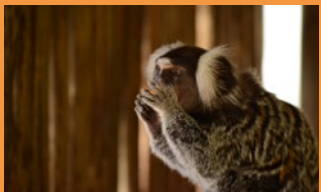
21-The Alpaca Loom

An alpaca farm, coffee shop, petting zoo and weaving studio all-in-one, located in Suid Agter Paarl Road. Here, alpacas are bred for their wool and, in the weaving studio, you can watch the weavers at their ancient craft, weaving scarves, shawls, ponchos and blankets. Kids will enjoy the Alpaca Barn Tour where they meet the resident herd including the youngest crias, or the guided Alpaca Walk accompanied by the friendliest alpacas. 22-Cheetah Outreach

Cheetah Outreach is a place of learning and interaction for kids and parents. On some African farms, cheetahs and other predators are often exterminated because they're a danger to the livestock. Cheetah Outreach strives to stop the extermination by promoting a livestock guardian-dog program, using Anatolian Shepherd Dogs. In short, the Anatolian Shepherds are trained to guard livestock. Once trained, the Anatolians are sent to participating farms as guardian dogs to deter predators. Cheetah Outreach is in Somerset West, and open to the public 7 days a week. 23-Exotic Animal World

This is a sanctuary that rescues and rehabilitates abandoned exotic pets, and often becomes a forever home for them. As such, it may be the only place where you and your kids can see and learn about exotic species, ethically. The rescued exotics here include spiders, snakes, monkeys, scorpions, and many bird species. All these exotics were either surrendered by their previous owners who could no longer take care of them, or confiscated by local authorities and given into the care of this sanctuary. 24-Winelands Light Railway

This rail and recreation park boasts large, partially shaded lawns, rail tracks, miniature steam trains and two electric engines. On weekends, between 11h00 and 15h00, the steam trains treat passengers to a 760m journey that lasts about 7 minutes. At other times, the electric engines take over. Families are welcome to bring picnics, but no braais and no alcohol. Well socialised dogs are welcome even on the trains, on leash, and owners must pick up the poop, so bring poop bags. 25-Le Bonheur Reptiles and Adventures

This farm is on the Babylonstoren Road, and they offer engaging encounters that nurture respect for the African Nile Crocodile and other reptiles.
